As you in the US are experiencing the heat of the summer, we are pulling out our winter clothes and putting extra blankets on our beds. In the past two weeks the weather has become very cool. Our family is now settled back in Nairobi after our time in Lokichoggio. We were blessed and privileged to be able to serve and get to know better missionaries who live and minister in southern Sudan.



This is a country with very unique challenges. There is no infrastructure - hospitals and schools are operated by outside organizations and supplies of any kind are scarcely available. This is the reason the majority of AIM AIR operations are in this part of the world. Even though our family is based back in Nairobi, John continues to fly regularly in Sudan.

Abby and Caroline have been very happy to be reunited with their friends in Nairobi. Last week they attended Vacation Bible School at their school. The older kids were even able to go ice skating! Yes, Nairobi does have an ice skating rink. They have also been taking horseback riding lessons for the past six weeks. This is a very welcomed break from home schooling. We are almost finished with the curriculum for Kindergarten and second grade. Caroline often reminds me, "Mama, you know you're not a real school teacher." I can always depend on her to keep me humble. I've recently had a great opportunity to do occupational and physical therapy with one of our fellow missionaries. Our friend, Murray Schmidt, was involved in a head-on collision with a bus. He suffered many fractures which required surgery and has been at home recovering. He will start walking this week after two months of bed rest. I do home visits several times a week and Abby likes to come along to be my assistant.

We are anticipating our home assignment coming up very soon. The girls and I will arrive home on August 9 and John on August 30. We will be available mid-September through December to speak in churches and to church/home groups. We look forward to seeing many of you a sharing with you what the Lord is doing through AIM AIR and AIM in Sudan, Kenya, and throughout East Africa.

We couldn't be here without you!!! Because of your help, many mouths are fed, many children are clothed, many medicines are delivered, many lives are saved, and most importantly, many souls are saved through the life giving knowledge and love of Jesus Christ. Thank You!
